Celebrating 25 years of service to the community, The North Texas Food Bank (NTFB) passionately pursues a hunger-free

North Texas through nutritious food distribution, advocacy and education. The NTFB is a nonprofit center for food distribution that procures donated surplus food and transfers it in usable quantities to over 678 feeding programs in 13 North Texas counties. These programs include food pantries, soup kitchens and shelters, after-school programs, senior citizen centers, low-income daycare centers and other social service centers. For every dollar donated to NTFB, we are able to provide five meals (\$1 = 5 meals). Out of each dollar donated, ninety-seven cents is used to feed hungry North Texas families.

Since founded in 1982, 330 million pounds of food have been distributed across our 13-county service area: Dallas, Denton, Collin, Fannin, Rockwall, Hunt, Grayson, Kaufman, Ellis, Navarro, Lamar, Delta and Hopkins counties. Last year alone, NTFB distributed 37 million pounds of food distributed from our warehouse. Each month, member agency pantries distribute food to more than 56,000 families and on-site meal programs served more than 494,000 meals/ snacks.

ating NTFB is the second largest food bank in Texas and one of the top ten largest food banks in the national network (America's Second Harvest). Gold-Pressed Latinum Tournament

Participation in the Annual Region Three Gold-Pressed Latinum (GPL) Tournament is limited to members of Region Three and STARFLEET, The International Star Trek Fan Association, Inc.

The Gold-Pressed Latinum Tournament is NOT gambling, and gambling of ANY type in connection with the Annual GPL Tournament is NOT endorsed nor permitted by Region Three. No individual participant in the GPL Tournament will "win" any monetary amount for themselves. The GPL Tournament is designed to raise operating funds for Region Three, the "winning" Chapter and the Summit's Charity for the year. The entrance amount is a donation made to Region Three and any awarded prizes are donations from Region Three to the "winning" chapter and charity. Participation in the GPL Tournament signifies that all players and observers understand and agree to the terms specified and that they accept the judgment of the "Pit Boss" as the judge/arbiter of any disputes that determine the "winner" of the Annual GPL Tournament. The "Pit Boss" will be selected by the Region Three Regional Coordinator.

A \$25 entry donation entitles the member the right to one seat, representing their chapter (or one of the other Region Three "Open" Chapters) during the GPL Tournament. Unless specified otherwise by a Chapter's CO, the first member of said Region Three Chapter to register for the GPL Tournament will represent their chapter in the tournament.

A Region Three Chapter not represented by the time the tournament is ready to start will be considered as being an "open" seat should someone wish to participate 4. Full House and represent said chapter in the tournament. "Open" chapter seats may be represented by anyone making the \$25 entry donation with the understanding that should they "win" the tournament, they 9. One Pair will split the award donation equally (50/ 10. High Card 50) between their chapter and the chapter they are representing. If more than one person wishes to represent an "open" chapter's seat, then bidding will start at \$30 and proceed in even increments of \$1 until someone wins the bid for said "open" seat.

The funds raised from the entry donations will be distributed as follows:

Winner's Share -- Region Three will donate 40% of the total entry donations to the "winning" chapter to be used on chapter related expenses. The Chapter's CO will need to report back to the region how this donation was utilized.

Region's Share -- Region Three will retain 40% of the total entry donations to be used on Region Three related expenses. The region will list how any and all regional funds are utilized in an upcoming issue of Fleet Channels.

Charities Share -- Region Three will donate 20% of the entry donations to the Summit's selected charity selected for that year. This amount will be reported in an upcoming issue of Fleet Channels with all other revenue generated from the Summit.

Rules of Play

The game will be Texas Hold'em, played with a standard deck of 52 playing cards. The Jokers will be removed and not used. The rule book used for this game will be the current edition of Hoyle's Rules of the Game, as interpreted by the "Pit Boss." Players may appeal a dealer's decision to the "Pit Boss", but the decisions of the "Pit Boss" are final.

The order of winning hands is as follows:

- 1. Royal Flush
- 2. Straight Flush
- 3. Four of a Kind
- 5. Flush
- 6. Straight
- 7. Three of a Kind
- 8. Two Pairs



Play will be divided into two rounds: The Preliminary Round and The Final Round. Each round will last until only one player holds all of the chips from their table or the one-hour time limit has been reached. If, at the end of one hour there is still more than one player left, the player with the most chips wins and moves on to the next round.

The Preliminary Round will consist of as many as 6 tables of 5 players each, with a non-playing dealer. At least one player from each table will move on to The Final Round. If 6 or less players enter the tournament, then only the Final Round will be Items will be displayed. The Final Round will be dealt by the "Pit Boss" or Region Three Regional Coordinator, if they are not one in the same.

The "ante" for each hand is one credit. The player on the dealer's right will cut the cards and five cards will be dealt to each player, face down. The player on the dealer's left will have the first bet. Nothing is required to open the betting. Betting will proceed without limit until all playthe players for cards. A maximum of three BID. cards may be drawn unless the Player holds an Ace. In that case, the player must show the card to the table, and then may draw four cards. Once all players have had the opportunity to draw cards, the player who opened the betting (or the next player to their left if the original had folded) will re-open betting again. Betting will proceed without limit until all players are satisfied. Once betting has stopped, the better being called will show their hand, followed by the remaining players. The highest hand, as ranked above, will win.

On the next hand, the player who opened

betting on the previous hand will cut the cards, and the player on their left will open the betting. The right to cut the cards and open betting will rotate in this manner for the remainder of the game. Play will continue until only one player holds all of the chips from their table or the onehour time limit has been reached, and then the player with the most chips wins.

The Final Round will be played in the same manner as the Preliminary Round. The winner of the Final Round will be declared as the winner of the Summit's Annual GPL Tournament and their chapter will receive the Winner's Share of the entry donations from the Region.

SUMMIT AUCTION

On those items with bids, we will begin with the top bid listed and see if anyone else wants to bid higher. If not, that person has the item for that amount. We have computerized the auction this year, so it should go faster.

DO NOT FORGET YOUR AUCTION BIDers are satisfied. The dealer will then ask DER NUMBER BEFORE YOU MAKE A

> We will keep track of the items by Auction Number. You can either pay the cash amount and pick up your auction items or sign a Region Three IOU for that amount. For example, the donation/fine required to put R3 RC Brad Pense in Fashion Jail for 20 minutes would be the sentence (\$8) plus the position fine (\$4) for a total of \$12.00

NOTE: An Arrest Warrant can not be

placed on a panel presenter within 15 minutes of their start time or during their panel. However a Klingon Arrest Officer can be waiting for them after their panel.

Credits, they will only have the chips that are to be used during play.


