Tanks Take on Trek 2LT Tank Clark, USS Regulator

This issue's episode: "Lower Decks", Star Trek: The Next Generation, Original Air Date: 5 February 1994 (Season 7, Episode 15)

As I may have mentioned, I missed an awful lot of ST:TNG when it was originally aired, and thanks to the weirdness of re-run syndication, I recently watched this episode for the first time ever. I think it's one of my favorite TNG episodes now. Perhaps it's because I identify with junior officers; perhaps it's simply because it's such a great episode. Regardless, if you haven't seen this episode and want to remain "spoiler-free," read something else.

The story begins in the Ten Forward lounge, where CDR Riker and Counselor Troi are discussing the current round of crew evaluations. At a different table are this episode's heroes, ENS Sam Lavelle, ENS Sito Jaxa, ENS Taurik, & Nurse Alyssa Ogawa. We also learn that although all four ensigns are up for promotion, Lavelle and Sito are competing for the same position: Ops night duty officer.

After the commercial break, we join the crew during a battle drill. Lavelle is at Conn, Sito at Tactical (with Worf looking on sternly), and Taurik in Engineering with LCDR La Forge. Following the drill, Riker gives Sito advice but snaps at Lavelle, who acknowledged an order with more than one "aye." I thought Riker was nitpicking... "Aye, aye" is acceptable, if slightly redundant. CAPT Picard comes in & orders a course change to the Argaya system near the Cardassian border, and pulls the senior officers into the briefing room. ENS Sito is told to take Ops, and she and Lavelle chat a bit. Lavelle, by this point, is convinced his chances for promotion are slim at best. Meanwhile, in Engineering, Taurik is overenthusiastic (imagine, an enthusiastic Vulcan) in discussing some ideas with La Forge. When we cut to Sickbay, Dr. Crusher tells Ogawa that she's recommending her for promotion.

Later, LT Worf encourages ENS Sito by informing her that he was the one who recommended her for Ops. Meanwhile, Lavelle tries to ingratiate himself with CDR Riker; unfortunately, the ensign was misinformed – he thought the first officer was Canadian, not Alaskan. A painfully uncomfortable conversation ensues:

"You know, my grandfather was Canadian."

"Really?"

"Are you one too, sir?"

"A grandfather?"

"No, Canadian, sir. Canadian."

"No, I was born in Alaska."

Near the Cardassian border, USS Enterprise-D searches for and finds an escape pod, on the other side of the border, outside of transporter range. After some adjustments by La Forge and Taurik, the occupant of the pod is beamed directly into sickbay. Only senior officers are allowed in, and ENS Sito is guarding the door outside. Picard visits his "guest," then takes Sito with him to his ready room. There, he proceeds to gripe her out about an incident at the Academy (go watch the episode entitled "The First Duty" for more information). After the captain tells the ensign he doesn't understand how she was assigned to his ship, Sito is dumbstruck, and leaves without defending herself.

Meanwhile, ENS Taurik and LCDR La Forge are shooting a shuttlecraft with a phaser rifle. Taurik is curious, but La Forge refuses to explain, instead telling the Vulcan ensign some cock-and-bull story about testing aspects of the shuttlecraft. At the same time in Sickbay, Ogawa is sworn to secrecy and then enlisted by Crusher to assist in an emergency surgery on the mystery guest: a Cardassian.

That evening, we see two poker games: one with the four ensigns and Ben, a civilian waiter in Ten Forward, and one with many of the senior officers. I really like how the two groups are shown to be so very similar, personality-wise. I also enjoyed Laville's response to discovering that the other three officers know, or have deduced, something about the Enterprise's current mission that he doesn't. (I'm going to have to remember this next time I plot out an adventure for the Star Trek RPG!) La Forge leaves his game to get Taurik and go to Engineering, and the junior's game breaks up.

In what appears to be the next day, after his martial arts class, Worf puts Sito through an interesting situation as part of an initiation to his advanced class. After being knocked around, and down, quite a few times, she finally loses her temper and refuses to take part in the unfair test. Sito learns her lesson the hard way – she learns to stand up for herself when she's being unfairly attacked. Taking Worf's advice, she asks Picard to judge her by what she's done on Enterprise, not at the Academy. The captain is pleased, and offers the Bajoran ensign an important and dangerous assignment. She agrees to pose as the

Cardassian's hostage. (It turns out that the Cardassian, Joret Dal, is a spy for the Federation, and needs to get back across the border.) He "steals" the shuttle that La Forge and Taurik damaged, and heads back across the border with Sito, who is dressed in Bajoran mufti. The plan is that after they make it through the Cardassian patrols, Sito is to get into the shuttle's escape pod, return to Federation space, and be recovered by the Enterprise.

Later, back onboard Enterprise, ENS Lavelle scans Cardassian space for the escape pod, and is told by CDR Riker to narrow the scan field to look for Bajoran life signs. Only after launching a probe do they detect something: debris. According to intercepted Cardassian message traffic, a Bajoran prisoner was killed in her pod while trying to escape. CAPT Picard makes an announcement to the crew: "To all Starfleet personnel: this is the captain. It is my sad duty to inform you that a member of the crew, Ensign Sito Jaxa has been lost in the line of duty. She was the finest example of a Starfleet officer and a young woman of remarkable courage and strength of character. Her loss will be deeply felt by all who knew her. Picard out."

Afterward, Taurik, Ogawa and Lavelle are in Ten Forward. Lavelle shows his friends the pip he's received for his promotion to LTJG, and ponders if he was promoted only because Sito died. He's told to honor her memory by excelling in his new position. The episode ends with Ben convincing LT Worf to join the junior officers in remembering Sito.

I can't say enough good things about this episode. The story was amazing, and I have since watched it two more times within the space of a week. Seeing the senior officers and the missions from the viewpoint of junior officers is a wonderful change, and I've learned things about them that I never saw in any other show of this or any other Trek series.
